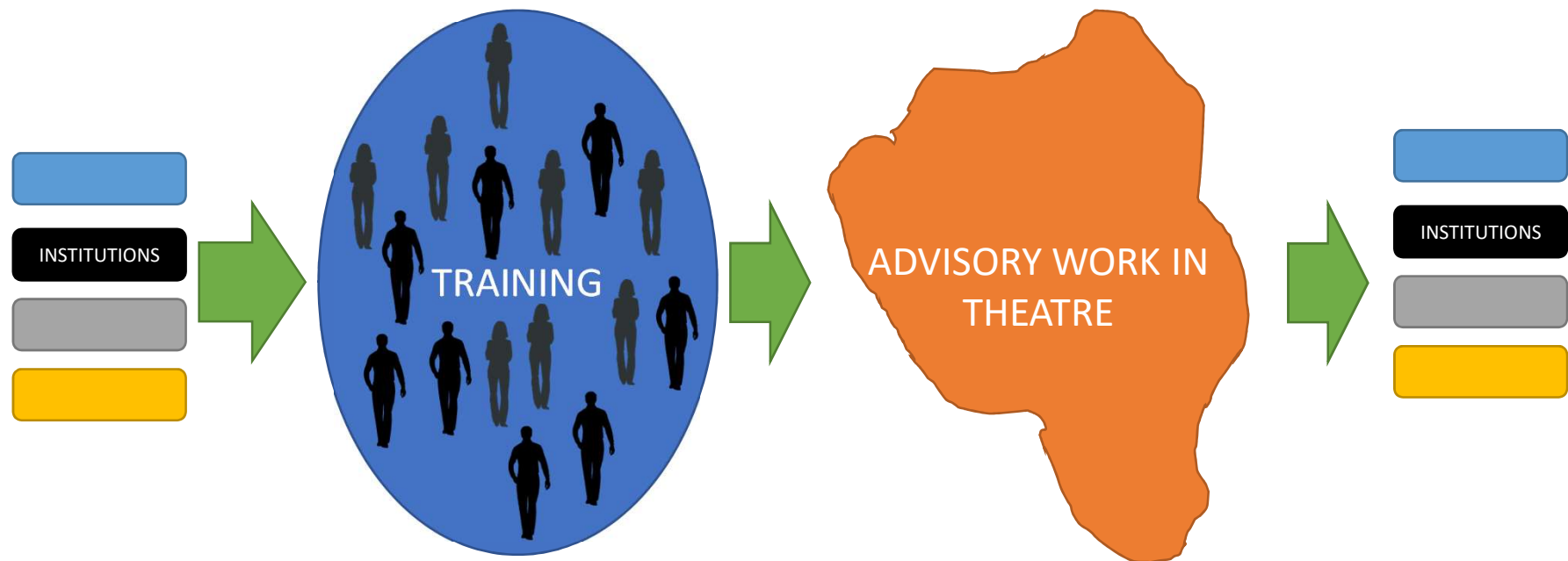

“I am better equipped to communicate, influence and manage professional relationships with peers, more senior colleagues and external stakeholders in my current role in my local Police Force.

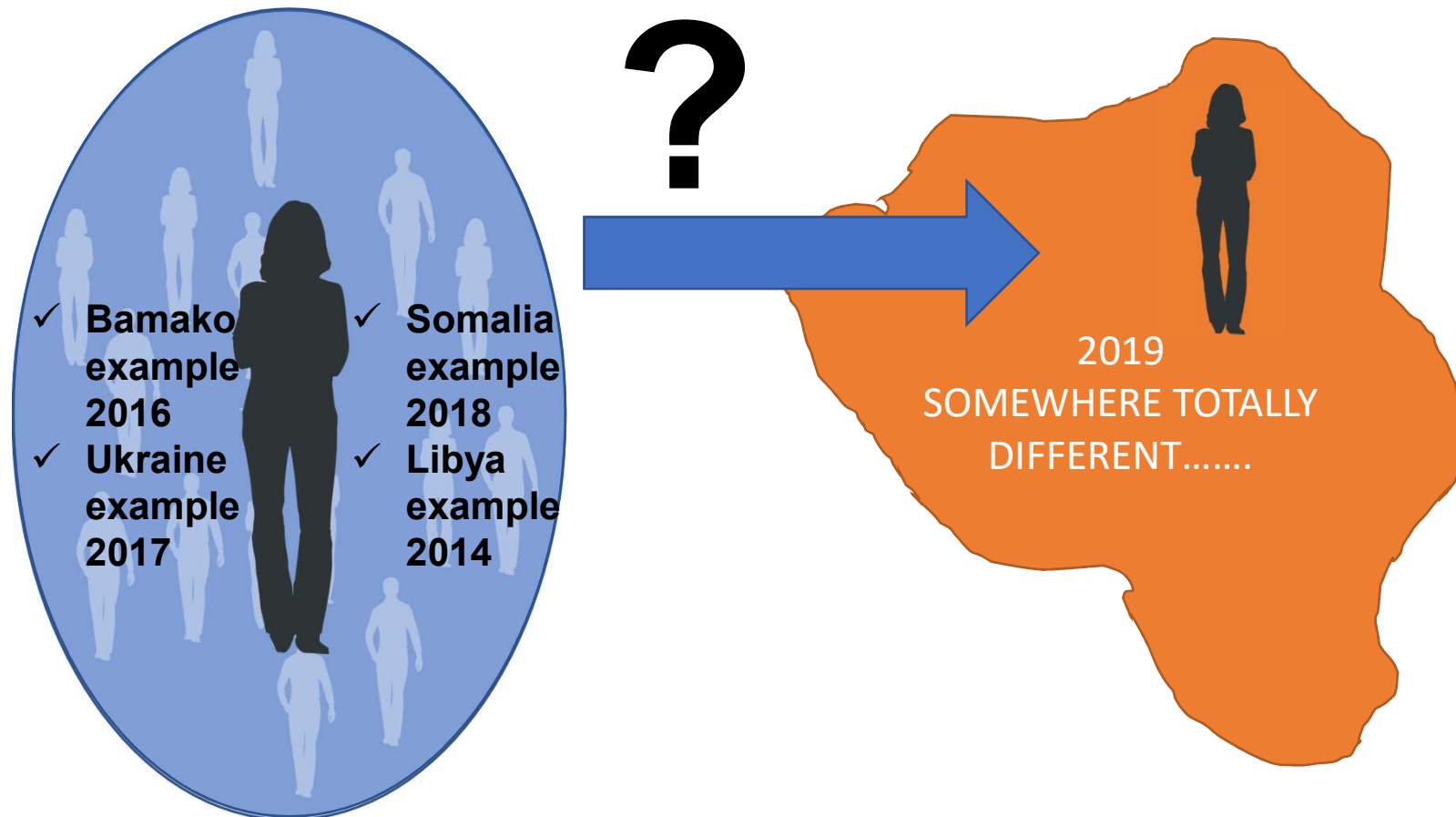


I have felt more confident to articulate my skills and experience as a Police Adviser in presentations and application processes and have applied for more senior roles.
